1	boastfully	adv. 1 inclined to brag; 2 exhibiting selfimportance <i>"Peter crowed boastfully above the rooftops, certain that no boy in all of Neverland could match him."</i>
1	captivate	v. to attract and hold someone's attention. <i>"Peter could captivate any child with a single story, making even the most frightened forget their fears."</i>
1	defiant	adj. showing resistance or disobedience. <i>"Peter stood defiant at the prow, arms folded, daring Hook to come one step closer to his friends."</i>
1	disdainful	adj. feeling or showing scorn contempt or aloofness. <i>"Peter was utterly disdainful of growing up, dismissing it as the dullest thing he had ever heard of."</i>
1	disenchant	v. to lose the feeling of excitement or pleasure about something; to become disappointed or disillusioned <i>"Nothing could disenchant Peter; the very idea of ordinary life made him crow with scornful laughter."</i>
1	exultant	adj. jubilant; filled with joy <i>"Peter felt exultant as he soared above the clouds, leaving the nursery window far behind."</i>
1	illuminated	v. made something visible by shining light on it. <i>"Tinker Bell's glow illuminated the darkened cavern just enough for the children to find their footing."</i>
1	imperious	adj. 1 like or in the manner of an absolute ruler in expecting obedience; domineering; 2 extremely urgent and absolutely necessary; imperative <i>"Hook's imperious gaze swept the deck, daring any pirate to question the order he had just given."</i>
1	menacingly	adv. 1 to utter or direct a threat against; threaten; 2 to serve as a probable threat to; imperil. <i>"Hook advanced menacingly across the plank, his iron claw gleaming in the cold moonlight."</i>
1	rapturously	adv. in an ecstatic manner <i>"The children listened rapturously as Wendy began another tale of knights, mermaids, and forgotten lands."</i>
1	relentless	adj. not relenting; harsh; pitiless persistent; unremitting <i>"The ticking crocodile was relentless in its pursuit, trailing Hook across every corner of Neverland."</i>
1	swagger	verb and noun. 1 to walk or move in a proud or arrogant manner; strut; 2 to be loud and conceited; boast; brag. <i>"Hook would swagger along the gangplank each morning, reminding every pirate who commanded the vessel."</i>
1	treacherous	adj. likely to betray trust or confidence; dangerous and unpredictable. <i>"The treacherous lagoon glittered beautifully by day, yet claimed many a careless swimmer after dark."</i>
1	unforgiving	adj. not willing to forgive or show mercy <i>"Neverland was an unforgiving place after dark, where even the bravest lost boys kept very still."</i>
1	wistfully	adv. in a way that shows sad longing. <i>"Wendy gazed wistfully from the window, half hoping Peter might reappear on the moonlit sill."</i>
