

dramatic irony *(dra-mat-ic-i-ro-ny)*

Definition

n. A literary technique, originally used in Greek tragedy, by which the full significance of a character's words or actions is clear to the audience or reader although unknown to the character.

Example Sentence

In the play, **dramatic irony** occurs when the audience knows the hero's fate but the hero does not.

The use of **dramatic irony** heightened the tension as the characters remained oblivious to the looming danger.
