

Teller Amendment *(Tel-ler-Am-end-ment)*

Definition

In ref. An amendment to a joint resolution of the United States Congress, enacted on April 20, 1898, in reply to President William McKinley's War Message. It placed a condition on the United States military's presence in Cuba.

The **Teller Amendment** was significant in the context of the Spanish-American War.

The **Teller Amendment** stipulated that the United States could not annex Cuba.
